## **THOUGHT**

God becoming man is one of the greatest miracles of all time. It's interesting that he didn't come as a powerful ruler or invincible warrior as the Jews expected, but rather as a little baby, born in a stable. Jesus fulfilled over 300 prophecies in his lifetime. Here are 5 from his birth. 1) Jesus will come from the line of Abraham. *Prophecy: Genesis 12:3. Fulfilled: Matthew 1:1.* 2) Jesus' mother will be a virgin. *Prophecy: Isaiah 7:14. Fulfilled: Matthew 1:18–23.* 3) Jesus will be born in the town Bethlehem. *Prophecy: Micah 5:2. Fulfilled: Luke 2:1–7.* 4) Jesus will be a member of the tribe of Judah. *Prophecy: Genesis 49:10. Fulfilled: Luke 3:33.* 5) Jesus' birth will be accompanied with great suffering and sorrow. *Prophecy: Jeremiah 31:15. Fulfilled: Matthew 2:16.* Some of these, like his birthplace, would have been impossible for him to choose to fulfill, even if he wanted to. Today we'll be studying Jesus' birth foretold and what it means to us, personally.



"26 In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, <sup>27</sup>to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. <sup>28</sup>The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you." <sup>29</sup>Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. <sup>30</sup>But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. 31 You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. <sup>32</sup>He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, 33 and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end." 34"How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?" 35The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. <sup>36</sup>Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. 37 For no word from God will ever fail." 38"I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her." Luke 1:26-38 (NIV)

#### 1. MARY'S PREDICAMENT

Can you imagine being a young virgin, engaged to a man, and becoming miraculously pregnant? What would have been most difficult for you to comprehend: Being chosen by God? Getting pregnant as a virgin? Giving birth to the Messiah? How to explain this to your fiancé Joseph and others?

#### 2. MARY'S RESPONSE

"<sup>46</sup>And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord <sup>47</sup>and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, <sup>48</sup>for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, <sup>49</sup>for the Mighty One has done great things for me— holy is his name."

#### Luke 1:46-49 (NIV)

How do you you think Mary felt about giving birth to the Messiah? Fear? Honor? Joy? Burden? Mary's response was to declare herself God's servant and to invite God to fulfill his word through her. She followed that up by announcing the news to her relative, Elizabeth with a song of worship. How would you have felt about giving birth to the Messiah? How do you think you would have broken the news to others?

#### 3. INTRODUCING THE MESSIAH

# Here is a famous essay about Jesus called One Solitary Life:

He was born in an obscure village, the son of a peasant woman.

He grew up in another village, where he worked in a carpenter's shop until he was thirty. Then for three years he became a wandering preacher.

He never wrote a book. He never held an office. He never had a family or owned a house. He didn't go to college. He never visited a big city. He never travelled two hundred miles from the place where he was born. He did none of those things one usually associates with greatness.

He had no credentials but himself.

He was only thirty-three when the tide of public opinion turned against him. His friends ran away. He was turned over to his enemies and went through a mockery of a trial. He was executed by the state. While he was dying, his executioners gambled for his clothing, the only property he had on earth. When he was dead he was laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

Twenty centuries have come and gone, and today he is the central figure of the human race and the leader of mankind's progress. All the armies that ever marched, all the navies that ever sailed, all the parliaments that ever sat, all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man on this earth as much as that **One Solitary Life**.
