
## PERSONAL APPLICATION

# THOUGHT

God becoming man is one of the greatest miracles of all time. It's interesting that he didn't come as a powerful ruler or invincible warrior as the Jews expected, but rather as a little baby, born in a stable. Jesus fulfilled over 300 prophecies in his lifetime. Here are 5 from his birth. 1) Jesus will come from the line of Abraham. *Prophecy: Genesis 12:3. Fulfilled: Matthew 1:1.* 2) Jesus' mother will be a virgin. *Prophecy: Isaiah 7:14. Fulfilled: Matthew 1:18–23.* 3) Jesus will be born in the town Bethlehem. *Prophecy: Micah 5:2. Fulfilled: Luke 2:1–7.* 4) Jesus will be a member of the tribe of Judah. *Prophecy: Genesis 49:10. Fulfilled: Luke 3:33.* 5) Jesus' birth will be accompanied with great suffering and sorrow. *Prophecy: Jeremiah 31:15. Fulfilled: Matthew 2:16.* Some of these, like his birthplace, would have been impossible for him to choose to fulfill, even if he wanted to. Today we'll be studying Jesus' birth foretold and what it means to us, personally.

And he gave him the name Jesus." Matthew 1:18-25 (NIV)

## 1. JOSEPH'S PREDICAMENT

"<sup>18</sup>This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit."

Matthew 1:18 (NIV)

If you had been Joseph, Mary's fiancé, when she was found to be with child, what would be the first thing that would have come to mind when Mary told you she was pregnant: There must be another guy? That's it, we're finished? She's never lied to me before so she must be telling the truth? Then God spoke to him through an angel in a dream. If God spoke to you through a dream and told you something humanly impossible was about to take place, would you believe the dream or your common sense? Does God speak to you in more mystical or more practical ways?

#### 2. JOSEPH'S RESPONSE

"<sup>19</sup>Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly."

Matthew 1:19 (NIV)

Joseph was a law-abiding citizen and according to Jewish law, Joseph could have pressed charges against Mary and had her publicly humiliated or worse. But Joseph was also a merciful man. How do you think you would have responded if you were in Joseph's place? Do you tend toward mercy or toward justice? *James 2:13* tells us that mercy triumphs over justice, why do you think this is true?

## 3. INTRODUCING JESUS

"<sup>20</sup>But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. <sup>21</sup>She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." <sup>22</sup>All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: <sup>23</sup>"The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us")."

Matthew 1:20–23 (NIV)

So God came to Joseph in a dream to tell him that his fiancée was miraculously pregnant by the Holy Spirit and revealed that their son would be both Savior and God in the flesh. That is a lot to process! 'Savior.' 'God in the flesh.' Suddenly these became much more than just words, more than just names or roles. The Messiah was going to be his son. Do you see Jesus as more than just an icon, more than just a historic figure? What does it mean to you that God lived a completely human life? What does it mean to you that God in the Flesh, Immanuel, died for your sins?
