WORD

Matthew 7:21 (NIV)

Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven.

THOUGHT

In times of worry, there are two kinds of people—those who seek God's kingdom, and those who seek the world. To say that we are seeking God's kingdom means that we surrender every area of our lives to Him, and that we desire to see His will done. We will see the kingdom of God come when it begins in the hearts of people.
